Explanatory Notes

Section B: Orders Discharged and Leave of Absences

- Under the Mental Health Act, a person can only be detained on a continuing care order if they meet the requirements of section 24 of the Act and there is no less restrictive alternative. If a patient is granted leave (under s 37 of the Act) during the first 28 days of their CCO, the Tribunal should be notified so that the Registrar can notify the person of the date and time of their review.
- The Tribunal must be notified of all patients discharged from their continuing care orders or community treatment orders in the previous week. If a patient's order is discharged prior to review by the Tribunal, the Tribunal should be notified within 48 hours.
- A review will not usually be held where a patient has been discharged from their order.
- If a patient is discharged from their CCO and placed onto a CTO, an 'Orders made or Renewed' notification should also be completed in relation to the CTO.
